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50-4.3	<p data-bbox="327 1037 1501 1104">To report the Revised Guidelines for Counting of Past Service/Experience of teaching faculty towards promotion under CAS and Promotion of Teachers under CAS</p> <p data-bbox="327 1144 1501 1346">The work of CAS promotion was undertaken by Hon'ble Vice Chancellor on priority basis after his joining. A Committee of external members was constituted on 16th June 2021 to examine the grievances of teachers towards their CAS promotion and recommend about counting of past services, experiences etc. The Committee convened its meeting and submitted case-wise recommendations. While going through the recommendation, it was observed that there are no guidelines on counting of past service and post-doc experiences.</p> <p data-bbox="327 1384 1501 1686">In pursuance to the UGC Regulations, instructions and resolution of the 47th EC (Agenda Item No. 47-5.12) of the University, guidelines for counting of the past service/experience for promotion of faculty members under CAS, were issued vide University Notification No. CURAJ/R/F.137/2022/983 dated 16.06.2022. However, during the execution of the same, some practical issues/genuine problems were being faced. To resolve the problems, a joint meeting of Past Service Counting Committee and the IQAC Sub-Committee were called alongwith Ms. Meenakshi Sahay, Joint Registrar, University of Delhi, who was the member of the Experts Committee constituted in the 43rd Meeting of the Executive Council (Agenda Item No. 43-6.3) to address the CAS grievances.</p> <p data-bbox="327 1727 1501 1895">On the basis of recommendation of the Past Service Counting Committee, the IQAC Sub-Committee and External Expert, the guidelines for counting of past service/experience of teachers were revised as issued vide Notification No. CURAJ/R/F.140/2022/2301 dated 23.09.2022 (Annexure-I), in supersession of the previous Notification No. CURAJ/R/F.137/2022/983 dated 16.06.2022.</p> <p data-bbox="327 1933 1501 2033">The cases of CAS promotion were examined by the committee constituted for Counting Past Service and IQAC Sub-committee/IQAC in-line with the UGC Regulations and University Notification No. 2301 dated 23.09.2022.</p> <p data-bbox="327 2067 1501 2101">Thereafter, meetings of Screening-cum-Evaluation were held on 29.11.2022, 19.12.2022,</p>

The University may look into the same and take appropriate measures with the approval of the statutory bodies.
